

In Most States You Can Still Throw Your Old TVs in the Trash

Old tube TVs contain many toxic materials, including four to eight pounds of lead. When TVs are tossed in the trash and end up in our landfills, they can break down and leach these toxic chemicals into our groundwater and surface water. Yet astonishingly, it's still perfectly legal to toss your old TV in the trash in most states.

Only Six States Had Disposal Bans In Place by the Digital Conversion

States have begun to pass legislation to keep TVs and other electronic waste out of their landfills and incinerators. But only six states will have disposal bans in effect at the time of the digital conversion on February 17 2009 (or June 12, 2009 – if Congress delays the conversion until then).

States With Disposal Bans Starting in 2010 or later

Some states have passed laws to ban e-waste from landfills, but they don't take effect until after the digital conversion. All of these passed their disposal bans as part of statewide e-waste recycling laws, which require the manufacturers to pay for electronics recycling. Typically, states have landfill bans begin a year after their recycling program is up and running.

Oregon	Jan 2010	Desktop computer, laptop, TVs and monitors with diagonal screen sizes more than 4 inches.
New York City	July 1, 2010	Computers, laptops, monitors, TVs, printers, keyboards, mice

Indiana	Jan 2011	Computers, Monitors, Laptops, DVD, VCRs, faxes, computer peripherals
New Jersey	Jan 2011	TVs, monitors, personal computers, laptops or components from them.
Illinois	Jan 2012	Computers, laptops, TVs, monitors, printers
North Carolina	Jan 2012	Computers, Monitors, Laptops, Keyboards, Mice, televisions
